



# 2010 SUMMER SCHOOL STUDENT ENROLLMENT INFORMATION



The Blue Springs R-IV School District is gearing up for the 2010 summer term and is inviting your student to attend. The elementary, middle, and high school level summer programs will be conducted within a four-week time frame starting on Friday, June 4<sup>th</sup>, and concluding on Wednesday, June 30<sup>th</sup>. The district will operate a Monday through Friday schedule (except first and last week) with elementary school hours being 8:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. and middle and high school hours being 7:30 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. (Session I - 7:30-10:45 a.m.; Session II - 11:15 a.m. to 2:30 p.m.). The Liggett Trail Education Center (LTEC) and grades 9-12 Extended School Year (ESY) programs will run Monday through Thursday from Monday, June 7<sup>th</sup>, through Thursday, July 15<sup>th</sup>. Hours of operation for the LTEC housed multi-disabled and early childhood programs will be 8:10-11:30 a.m. and 8:55-12:15 p.m. respectively. The grades 9-12 ESY program will be offered from 7:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. ESY eligible students will be enrolled separately for services through their resident school site (i.e., an enrollment form is not required of parents).

Elementary level summer school sites will host pre-K, K-5, and K-5 ESY specialized instructions programs as follows: Chapel Lakes, Daniel Young (ED), Franklin Smith (CI/VI/D-HH), James Lewis (AUT), James Walker (CI), and Sunny Pointe (AUT). Middle school students will attend at Moreland Ridge. Students in grades 9-12 will participate at the Freshman Center (i.e., credit recovery courses) or Hall-McCarter Education Center/VVHS (i.e., enrichment courses). Students enrolled in the early childhood and multi-disabled programs will be provided ESY services at the Liggett Trail Education Center. Grades 9-12 ESY students will attend at the Blue Springs High School North Annex.

Themes will be identified for elementary level students, and teachers will plan and conduct communication arts, math, science, and social studies activities that align accordingly. Possible K-5 rotation classes will be art, music, p.e., library media sciences, careers, foreign language, or technology (i.e., offerings will vary across the six sites). The district is also intending to staff a counselor at all six elementary sites. The pre-K program consists of activities designed to facilitate the transition from home to formal schooling. To attend the pre-K program, a student must be eligible to start kindergarten during the 2010-2011 school year. Students requiring specialized assistance in reading and/or math will receive pull-out or push-in services.

## SEVERAL ITEMS OF IMPORTANCE

1. Parents of elementary level students will be notified by mail of their child's placement prior to the start of summer school. Students will be placed in the course(s) they enroll for at the middle and high school levels.
2. Since district busing **IS NOT** provided for regular education summer school students, parents are responsible for transporting their child to and from the selected site on a daily basis. Transportation is only provided by the school district for special education Extended School Year (ESY) eligible students.
3. Summer school students at all levels must bring a sack lunch, including a beverage, with them each day (i.e., unless communicated otherwise by the building principal).
4. Students must be willing and able to attend the entire session/term (i.e., should not miss more than **two** days).
5. Even though progress may be reported at the elementary level, formal grades will not be given. Grades will be assigned for coursework at the middle and high school levels.
6. In some circumstances, summer school participation may be taken into consideration in respect to a retention/grade placement recommendation made by a classroom teacher or building principal at the end of the 2009-2010 school year.

Attached is an enrollment form that must be completed and returned to school no later than Friday, April 2<sup>nd</sup>. Applications for this summer's pre-K students will be provided during kindergarten enrollment activities on April 29<sup>th</sup> and 30<sup>th</sup> and should be completed and left with school personnel at that time. *Any application received after April 2<sup>nd</sup>, (i.e., other than for the Pre-K program) will not be guaranteed a summer school slot.* Please contact the Curriculum & Instruction Department (224-1300) pertaining to summer school related questions and/or concerns.

**Please note that summer school is contingent upon Missouri Department of Elementary and Secondary Education funding and that any changes will be communicated to district families in a timely manner if and when they occur.**

**PRE-K SUMMER SCHOOL APPLICATIONS WILL BE MADE AVAILABLE DURING ENROLLMENT SESSIONS HELD AT THE DISTRICT'S 13 ELEMENTARY SCHOOLS ON APRIL 29<sup>th</sup> AND APRIL 30<sup>th</sup>.**



# 2010 K-5 SUMMER SCHOOL STUDENT ENROLLMENT FORM



The 2010 summer school term operates for 19 consecutive school days June 4-June 30. Hours of daily operation are 8:30-3:30. Summer school site preference should be indicated by placing a #1 next to the first choice and a #2 next to an alternate location. A separate enrollment form should be returned to the resident school office for **each** participating student. Students targeted for specialized assistance in communication arts and/or math are strongly encouraged to attend and will be provided pull-out or push-in services as scheduled by appropriate staff at their summer school site (i.e., parents are notified by the referring school if their student qualifies to participate). A separate Pre-K program student enrollment form will be made available to parents during kindergarten enrollment. Parents of qualifying Extended School Year (ESY) students will be contacted directly regarding program specifics. **This form should be returned to the resident school office by FRIDAY, APRIL 2<sup>nd</sup>.**
