

**Electronics Policy:** The possession and use of Electronic Devices (EDs) is a privilege, not a right. The district may revoke the privilege of possessing and using EDs at anytime at its sole discretion. EDs include devices used to communicate, receive, send, store, record, or listen to voice, text, digital, audio, video, photo, electronic, or internet/cyberspace data, images, and/or information which shall include, but not be limited to, pagers, beepers, cellular phones, iPods, Personal Digital Assistants(PDA's), MP3 players, portable music players, CD players, game players, cameras, video cameras, etc. The district is not responsible for lost or stolen EDs, whether in student or district possession, or any damage to the ED, its programs, or its contents.

**GRADES 9-12:** EDs may be carried by students during the school day, but must be carried in an off or silent mode. EDs shall not be used to connect to district electronic equipment or district electronic networks at anytime. EDs may be used as follows:

Non-Academic Periods: EDs may be used, viewed, or listened to, by students during non-academic periods (including before and after school, passing periods, and lunch periods), but doing so shall be in violation of this policy if it results in a disruption to the educational environment or any school activity, impairs the morale or good conduct of other students, or is in violation of this policy, or any other district policy, or local, state, or federal law.

Academic Periods: EDs shall not be used, viewed, or listened to, during academic periods without the prior approval of administrators or staff.
